

PRIVACY NOTICE EDUCATION WELFARE SERVICE

This privacy notice covers how Pembrokeshire County Council (as a Data Controller) will collect, use and share your personal data for the purposes of the Education Welfare Service. We collect and use your personal information as we have a statutory duty to ensure children of compulsory school age are receiving a suitable education either by regular attendance or otherwise. This includes sharing information for safeguarding purposes such as Children Missing in Education. The Education Welfare Service also manages the Elective Home Education service, children missing in education (safeguarding), agency reports for safeguarding, child employment licenses and child performance.

Why we need your information (purpose of processing)

The information that you provide will be processed according to the UK General Data Protection Regulation, the Data Protection Act 2018, section 7 and sections 437-443 of the Education Act 1996, the Children Young Person Act 1933/63 and the Children (Performances and Activities) (Wales) Regulations 2015, Penalty Notice Regulations 2013, Sections 25-9 of Children Act 2004 and the All Wales Attendance Framework to ensure children are receiving a suitable education.

We will also make any disclosures required by law and we may also share this information with other bodies responsible for detecting/preventing fraud/crime or auditing/administering public funds to ensure money is targeted and spent in the most appropriate and cost effective way. In order to achieve this, information will be shared with our Audit Service within Pembrokeshire County Council and with The Auditor General for Wales (Audit Wales Privacy Notice).

We will not make any disclosures to third parties for marketing purposes.

Your data will be secure and confidential at all times and we will only collect the personal information that is required to provide you with our service.

What personal data is being collected?

The categories of personal data being collected are:

- Name and contact details of parent(s)/ carer
- Child's details including date of birth
- Emergency contact details for child's parent(s) / carer(s)
- Health information
- Criminal Conviction data (for chaperone applications)
- Additional Learning Needs
- Child's attendance record
- Ethnic group

What is our lawful basis for processing your personal data?

The UK General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) requires specific conditions to be met to ensure that the processing of your personal data is lawful. These relevant conditions are below:

Article 6 (1)(e) Public task: the processing is necessary for us to perform a task in the public interest or for our official functions, and the task or function has a clear basis in law.

Some types of personal data are more sensitive than others, and need more protection. This is classed as 'special category data' and could include information about your racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs or trade union membership and the processing of genetic or biometric data, health and sex life and sexual orientation. We process this type of special category data as it is necessary for reasons of:

Article 9 (2)(g) Substantial public interest.

(The relevant Data Protection Act 2018 condition is – Schedule 1 Part 2: Statutory and government purposes)

Who will we share your information with?

We may need to share your personal data with internal departments, other organisations and third parties, this will include:

- Internal departments of PCC which are Social Care and Housing
- Welsh government statistical data
- Other Local Authorities
- Health
- School

Pembrokeshire County Council has a duty to protect the public funds it manages. Therefore, the information that you have provided to us may be used for the prevention and detection of fraud and for auditing purposes both internally and externally.

The personal information we have collected from you will be shared with fraud prevention agencies who will use it to prevent fraud and money-laundering and to verify your identity. If fraud is detected, you could be refused certain services, finance, or employment. How long do we keep hold of your information?

Pembrokeshire County Council will only keep your information for as long as is necessary, we will retain the information provided to us until the child / young person reaches the age of twenty five years old unless the child has had a statement of special educational needs or has been in local authority care in which case longer statutory data retention rules apply. Data for chaperones is kept for 6 years. Information is then deleted or destroyed securely. Please contact us if you require further information on the retention rules that apply.

Your Rights

Under the UK General Data Protection Regulation and Data Protection Act 2018, you have rights as an individual including:

- The right to **Rectification** you have the right to ask to have your information corrected.
- The right to **Restrict** processing may apply you may request that we stop processing your personal data however, this may delay or prevent us delivering a service to you. We will seek to comply with your request but may be required to hold or process information to comply with our legal duties.
- The right to **Object** this is not an absolute right and will depend on the reason for processing your personal information.
- The right to **Erasure** you may request that we erase your personal data however, this may delay or prevent us delivering a service, or continuing to deliver a service. We will seek to comply with your request but may be required to hold or process information to comply with our legal duties.
- The right to not be subject to Automated decision making and profiling.
