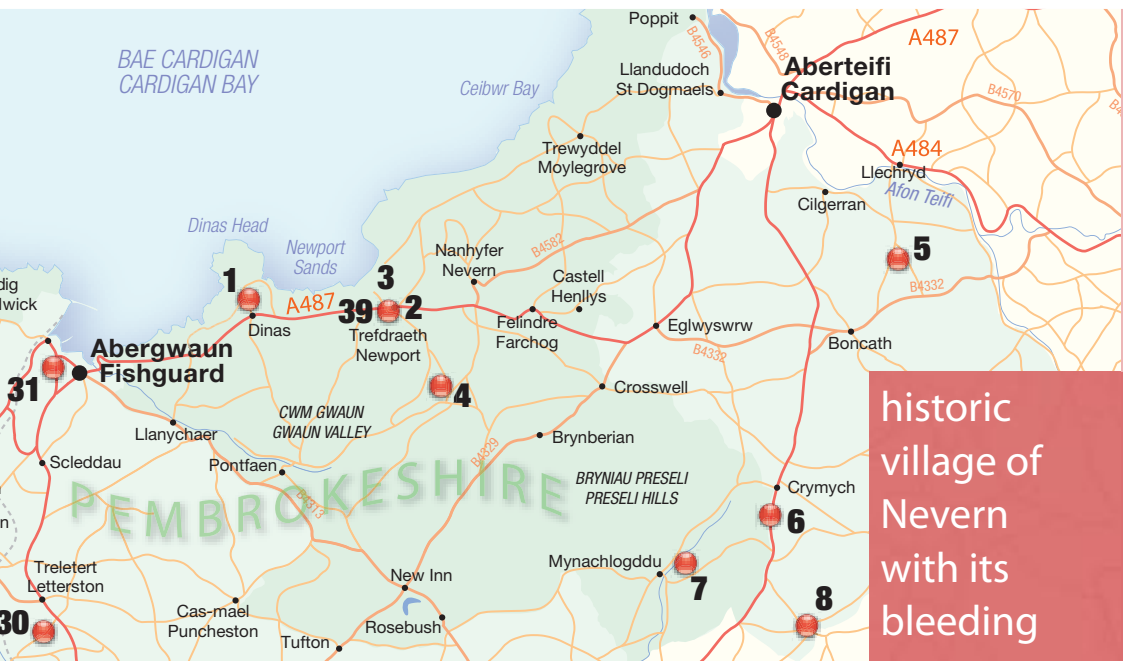


North-East Pembrokeshire Trail & Preseli's



historic village of Nevern with its bleeding yew tree and Castell Henllys Iron Age fort

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Starting on the main Fishguard road, just inland from Dinas Island and the pretty cove of Cwm yr Eglwys, you can explore the unique style of Alice Tennant in her gallery at Dinas Cross, before reaching the bustling seaside village of Newport.

A showcase of local artists and makers, where you will find stylish and original works, can be seen at Newport Collective and Pembrokeshire Craft Makers' exhibitions. Head on to the historic village of Nevern with its

bleeding yew tree and Castle Henllys Iron Age fort. Branch off right to Cilgwyn at the edge of the beautiful Gwaun Valley to browse Inger John's colourful hand-dipped candles.

Back on the main road to Cardigan over the Preseli Hills; watch out for Carn Bica ... - said to be the final resting place of King Arthur. Out of town, turn inland to follow the river Teifi to Llechryd, then right over the bridge past Hammett House to see beautifully designed silver and gold jewellery at John and Victoria's workshop. Travel through Boncath to Crymych

for the hot-forged original iron work designs and one-off sculptures of blacksmith Roy Thedval.

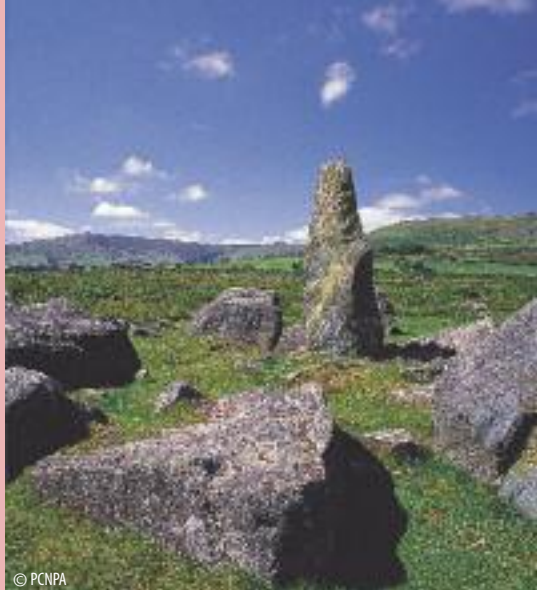
Bear right towards the Preselis for Mynachlogddu, where nestled in the hills Viv Lockton has an exclusive range of garments and yarn from her own flock of angora goats. Head back on the A478 towards Efailwen and turn left to Glandwr for the creative willow work of Cassandra Lishman. From traditional 'Cyntell' baskets to rustic chairs from her hand-harvested willow as well as her own designs of wool felt couture, including hats bags and brooches.

Gan ddechrau ar briffordd Abergwaun, ychydig i'r mwendir o Ynys Dinas a childraeth prydferth Cwm yr Eglwys, gallwch archwilio arddull unigryw Alice Tennant yn ei horiel yn Ninas, cyn cyrraedd pentref glan môr prysur Trefdraeth. Yn arddangos gwaith artistiaid a chrefftwyr lleol byddwch chi'n gweld gweithiau cain a gwreiddiol, a'r cyfan i'w gweld yn arddangosfeydd Cydweithfa Trefdraeth a Chrefftwyr Sir Benfro.

Ewch yn eich blaen i bentref hanesyddol Nanhyfer gyda'i choeden ywen waedlyd a chaer o oes Haearn Castell Henllys, ewch i'r dde i



Gilgwyn ar ymyl yr hyfryd Cwm Gwaun i bori drwy ganhwyllau lliwgar wedi'u gwneud â llaw Inger John. Yn ôl ar y briffordd i Aberteifi dros Fynyddoedd y Preseli; cadwch olwg am Garn Bica y dywedir mai yno y mae gorffwysfa derfynol Brenin Arthur. Y tu allan i'r dref throwch i'r mwendir i ddilyn afon Teifi i Lechryd, yna yn syth dros y bont heibio i Hammett House i weld y gemwaith arian ac aur wedi'i chynllunio'n hyfryd yng ngweithdy John a Victoria.

Teithiwch drwy Foncath i Grymch i weld cynlluniau gwaith haearn gwreiddiol gyredig poeth a cherfluniau unigryw'r gof Roy Thedval. Cadwch i'r dde tuag at Fynyddoedd y Preseli at Fynachlogddu, ac yno ynghanol y mynyddoedd mae gan Viv Lockton ystod unigryw o ddillad ac edafedd o'i phraidd ei hun o eifr angora.

Dychwelwch at yr A478 tuag at Efailwen a throwch i'r chwith tuag at Glandwr ar gyfer gwaith helyg creadigol Cassandra Lishman. O fasgedi 'Cyntell' traddodiadol i gadeiriau gwledig o'i helyg a gynaeafwyd â llaw ynghyd â'i chynlluniau ei hun o courture ffelt gwlan, gan gynnwys hetiau, bagiau a broetsHis.

Facilities: Admission free. Accept all major credit card. Demonstrations or explanations. Candle museum. Disabled access to ground floor. Toilet. Car parking. Parties and evening demonstrations and half-day workshops by prior arrangement.

We are on the left, just past the turning to Newchapel. OS Map Ref: 219412. Satellite Navigation by postcode will lead you astray - use GPS 52,0406, - 4.5981 or search 'John and Victoria Jewellery' in Google Maps.

Opening times: Easter to end of October, Monday to Friday 10.00am - 5.30pm. Closed weekends. Also open in December. Other times by appointment.

Facilities: Workshop where visitors can see work in progress and adjoining showroom, toilet, access and parking for cars and minibuses only.

Opening times: Monday to Friday 11.00am - 5.00pm. Please telephone if travelling any distance, as there may be occasions when I am attending exhibitions. By appointment during winter months.

Facilities: Gallery/showroom, workshop. Parking on premises (cars and minibuses).

Directions: A478 to Glandy Cross. Take road signposted Mynachlogddu for two and a half miles. Right at bungalow, half a mile, first farm on the left. OS Map Ref: SN 151 305.

Opening times: Easter to October usually open Tuesday to Friday 11.00am - 5.00pm. Usually open rest of the year but if you are travelling any distance please telephone - as on agricultural show dates.

Facilities: Small showroom with friendly welcome. Questions answered and goats can be seen on the farm.

Description: Cassandra creates willow sculptures, sculptural baskets, and traditional 'Cyntell' baskets. She also makes willow screens and rustic chairs. On her smallholding, she annually coppices then hand harvests all her own willow to create her beautiful crafts. Using locally sourced wool as well as merino, Cassandra also designs and creates 'Felt Couture'. Her products include brooches, waistcoats, hats, bags and scarves. At the workshop studio, there is a small range of products for sale, and in progress. Please phone if you have something particular in mind. You can also order bespoke items, or book a personal or group workshop.

Directions: From South Pembrokeshire (A40). Take the A478 north from Narberth towards Cardigan. About 4 miles after Glandy Cross, turn right (signposted) to Glandwr. At the village crossroads turn left. Approximately 400 yards after the bridge, the Tir-y-Gafel entrance is on the left. Go up the track, past a small car park, then take the right hand fork. Carry on up the hill, we are the second driveway on the left, with a slate sign saying Plas Helyg. From North Pembrokeshire (Cardigan), take the A478 south towards Tenby. About 2 miles after Crymych, turn left (signposted) to Glandwr. Follow directions as above.

Opening times: 10.00am - 5.00pm Thursdays and Fridays, Easter - October, other times by appointment only.

Facilities: Parking for cars and minibuses only. Guide dogs welcome. A tour of the willow beds can be arranged, willow cuttings also available.
