

We currently hold a premises licence PEMBS/PREMS/N/0278 and a Club Premises Certificate Club/GV/0010. We wish to surrender the Club Premises Certificate.
We wish to extend the existing Premises Licence area to cover the whole building at Haverfordwest Golf Club. This will enable us as a business to remain viable and as a club to maximise our current income stream and attract a wider customer base to our venue.
We would like to extend our current offer of Sunday lunches, meals and pre-booked private parties and functions and make use of the whole building to members as well as non-members and walk in visitors.
All current licensable activities and all current timings would remain unchanged apart from those added as part of the variation we are seeking to include films. We wish to add films onto the existing licensable activities on the premises licence.
Part A of our existing premises licence and a new updated premises plan has been included as part of our application to vary.
The current operating schedule is considered suitable and sufficient for the variation we are seeking.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

When using the Premises in exercise of the Licence, the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or Premises Licence Holder (PLH) shall at all times comply with the Licence conditions and shall only stage the type of Licensable Activity permitted by the Licence.

The DPS or PLH or some other person authorised by them (the Nominee) shall be present on the Premises throughout the time that the Premises are open for Licensable Activities.

The DPS or PLH shall ensure that the Nominee is made aware of the conditions or operating plan, where appropriate, of the Licence.

The DPS, PLH or Nominee will ensure that nothing takes place on the Premises, which constitutes a disorder or a breach of the peace, or any activity, which involves the misuse of drugs, unlawful betting or gaming, or any other unlawful activity.

The DPS or PLH or Nominee will ensure that nothing takes place on the Premises which is indecent or likely to be grossly offensive to any person on the Premises.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The PLH or DPS or other employed staff involved with the running of the Premises are instructed to ensure that there is no disorder within the Premises.

No person carrying any form of alcoholic drink, whether open or sealed, will be admitted to the Premises at any time.

All bottles and glasses will be removed from public areas as soon as they are finished with or empty. Any instances of disorder will be recorded in an Incident Book.

c) Public safety

Emergency lighting will be provided to enable persons to find their way out of the Premises in the event of a failure of the normal lighting and such installations shall be serviced, inspected and tested to ensure compliance with the prevailing British Standard.

The toilets shall be kept in good order and repair and shall be properly and effectively cleaned, lit, ventilated and supplied with hot and cold running water, soap and adequate hand drying facilities. The DPS or PLH shall ensure that there is in force during the currency of the Licence an appropriate Public Liability Insurance Policy relating to the use of the Premises for Licensable activities and a copy shall be displayed at the principal point of entry and lodged with the Local Authority.

All fabrics, curtains and drapes shall be of a flame retardant material or treated with a suitable durable flame retardant substance to ensure compliance with the prevailing British Standard.

All floor coverings will be secured and maintained so that they will not ruck and form trip hazards. First Aid equipment shall be provided and maintained in the Premises and the location of such equipment shall be clearly indicated by notices.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Signs shall be displayed at the exit from the Premises requesting that customers leave the Premises in a quiet and orderly way.

The volume of music shall be lowered 10 minutes before the terminal hour. No bottles or glasses shall be allowed off the Premises after the terminal hour.

e) The protection of children from harm

Before commencing their duties, all new employees will receive information and training concerning the sale of alcohol.

Such training will cover their legal responsibilities and the action to be taken by them should they be suspicious that a person under the legal age is attempting to purchase alcohol, or that another person is attempting to purchase alcohol for consumption by a person under the legal age.

The DPS or PLH will keep records to verify that all employees who may sell alcohol have received appropriate training.

The DPS, PLH and all employees who may sell alcohol shall require sight of a PASS approved age card, a passport, or a photo driving licence from all persons who they reasonably suspect might be under the legal age to purchase alcohol.

An A5 sign reading "It is illegal for any person under the age of 18 to attempt to purchase alcohol" will be displayed in a conspicuous place at the principal entrance to the Premises.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.
- 3. In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:
 - Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.

- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
