M Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

We will abide by all our licensing conditions & Due to the type of premises & targeted custom we do not expect & highly discourage drunk & disorderly or aggressive behaviour however we will make sure all staff are made aware of the 4 premises licence objectives & remain vigilant when it comes to looking out for any persons expressing the potential to become a nuisance or danger to ourselves or the general public, that there is no sale of alcohol to underage people, that no harm should come to any children & that there's no suspicious behaviour involving the use or sale of illegal substances.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We as a campsite we aim to please families & have zero tolerance toward dangerous or disorderly behaviour of any kind! Ways in which we would endeavour to prevent this would include: Having a clear notice displayed on the premises stating the usual hours under the terms of the premises licence within which alcohol could be consumed, the not selling of alcohol to any persons thought to be already intoxicated, keeping a refusals register & remaining vigilant whilst preventing the use or sale of any drugs or illegal substances.

c) Public safety

We have a public liability policy in place, staff are trained to adhere to environmental health requirements and will be trained to perform underage ID checks, we have fire safety points throughout, a fully stocked first aid box, we provide littler & recycling bins for safe disposal of waste & we make sure that all fixtures, fittings, doors, electricals, heating and other installations are maintained at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We are a private property situated in farmland however to avoid the disruption of other campsite users we will ask anyone being too loud on site to keep it down & if they refuse to do so they will be asked to leave, we do not allow large parties of people on site so that large gatherings of loud/talking people are kept to a minimum, people staying on site are discouraged from arriving too early or leaving late, all deliveries to the site are done so within reasonable working hours & adequate waste & recycling bins are provided.

e) The protection of children from harm

There will be no sales to anyone under the age of 18

We will enforce a challenge 25 regime within which staff will be trained to challenge anyone who looks to be under the age of 25 & ask that they provide photo ID such as a passport or drivers licence to prove they are 18 or over before any sale of alcohol takes place

 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an
 endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or
 has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official
 document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name
 issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home
 Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the
 UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from
 doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in
 combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their
 permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office
 acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the
 person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such
 as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member – e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

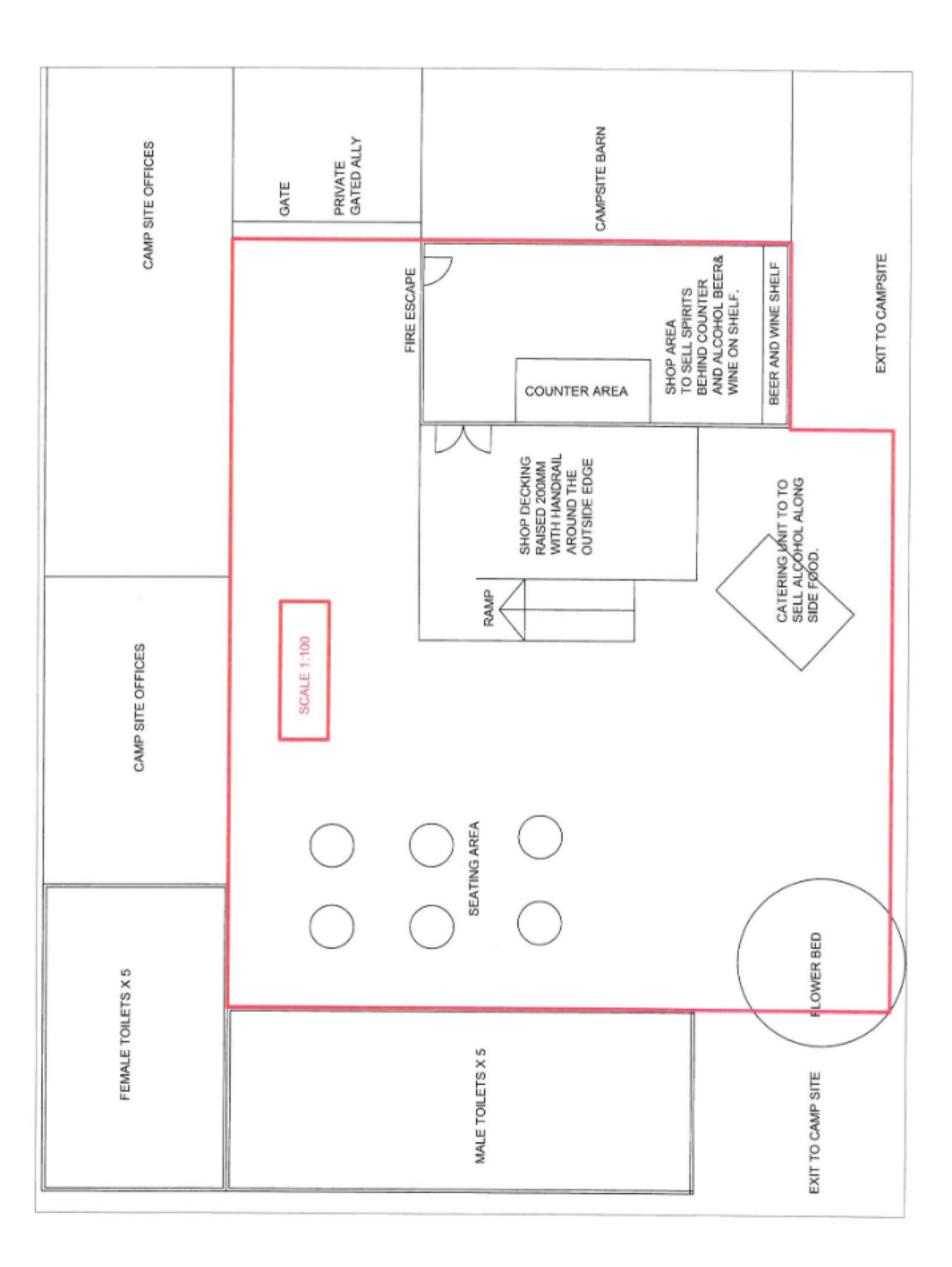
