a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

When using the Premises in exercise of the Licence, the Designated Premises Supervisor Premises licence holder shall at all times comply with the Licence Conditions and shall only hold the type of Licensable Activity specified in the Licence.

The Designated Premises supervisor or premises licence holder or some other person authorised by the Designated Premises supervisor or premises licence holder ("the Nominee") shall be present on the Premises throughout the time that the Premises are open for Licensable activities.

The Designated Premises supervisor or premises licence holder shall ensure that the Nominee is made aware of the conditions or operating plan where appropriate of the Licence.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The Premises Licence Holder, the Designated Premises Supervisor and/or the personal licence holders and other employed staff involved with the running of the premises are instructed to ensure that there is no disorder, or offensive, or indecent behaviour within the premises.

The Premises Licence Holder, the Designated Premises Supervisor and/or the personal licence holders and other employed staff involved with the running of the premises will not allow access to or allow to remain on the Premises any person who is drunken or violent.

No customers carrying any form of alcoholic drink, whether open or sealed, will be admitted to the premises at any time.

No customers will be permitted to take open containers of alcoholic or soft drinks from the premises.

All bottles and glasses will be removed from public areas as soon as they are finished with or empty.

Records to be maintained in an incident book in order to record all details, of instances of public disorder. These records will be available to officers of the Dyfed Powys Police and Pembrokeshire County Council Licensing Authority upon request.

The premises will be a member of BOBB and a representative will use best endeavours to attend BOBB meetings and participate in all initiatives.

The provision of SIA registered doorpersons must be considered when events are staged at the venue providing the sale of alcohol and the provision of live/recorded music and or the facilities for dancing

Where such doorpersons are provided.

The doorpersons must be on duty from the scheduled start time of the event or function and will remain on duty until all members of the public have left the venue and vicinity.

Door persons will be provided in the ratio of 2 for the first one hundred persons and one per additional one per hundred or part of one hundred persons. (e.g. 140 persons would require 3 doorpersons).

Where admission is by pre sold ticket/ written invitation, the number of doorpersons required based on the above formula will match the number of persons invited and admitted as described.

Where the numbers are not predetermined or on occasions where entry by payment or otherwise will be allowed on the door, then the number of doorpersons based on the above formula will match the maximum occupancy figure for the venue.

At all times when registered doorpersons are deployed at the Premises, the names, addresses and full SIA registration numbers will be entered in a register, prior to them commencing their duties.

The register shall be made available at all reasonable times and produced for inspection upon request by any licensing officer of the local authority, pollution control officer of the local authority, officer of the fire authority, Police licensing officer, Constable of the Dyfed Powys Police

The register will be available for inspection for 1 year after the date of the latest entry.

Following a n risk assessment carried out by the Premises Licence holder or Designated Premises Supervisor, it may be determined by the Premises Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor that the requirements of the four licensing objectives will be safely met without the presence of SIA registered door supervisors.

c) Public safety

The Premises Licence Holder and/or the Designated Premises Supervisor will undertake training of the employees and the use of emergency evacuation procedures.

All Exit Doors shall be clearly identified by an exit sign of the graphic design with any wording i.e. "EXIT" being supplementary.

All Exit Doors shall be constructed so as to open outwards and the Exit Doors and the Exit Routes shall at all times remain free of obstruction.

All securing devices preventing /restricting the opening of any doors will be disabled prior to the Premises being opened.

All Exit Doors fitted with panic type fastenings shall be identified by a notice stating "PUSH BAR TO OPEN" in white capital letters of at least 50 mm in height, of a proportionate width and conspicuously displayed on or immediately above the horizontal bar of the Exit Door.

Emergency lighting shall be provided to enable persons to see their way out of the Premises in the event of the failure of normal lighting.

All toilets shall be kept in good order and repair and be properly and effectively cleaned, lit, ventilated and supplied with hot and cold running water, soap and adequate hand drying facilities and in the case of female toilets adequate provision shall be made for the disposal of sanitary dressings.



The Designated Premises supervisor or premises licence holder shall ensure that there is in force during the currency of the Licence an appropriate Public Liability Insurance Policy relating to his use of the Premises for Licensable Activities, a copy of which shall be on display at the Principal Point of Entry, when practicable, and shall also be lodged with the Authority.

All floor coverings will be secured and maintained so that they will not ruck.

First Aid equipment shall be provided and maintained at the Premises at all times and the location of such equipment shall be clearly indicated by notices.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

A sufficient number of suitable receptacles with properly fitted covers shall be provided for the purpose of receiving refuse from the Premises and adequate arrangements shall be made for the regular removal of all refuse from the Premises.

The Designated Premises supervisor or Premises licence holder shall take all steps reasonably practicable to prevent a noise nuisance at any neighbouring properties, during the hours of operation.

The Designated Premises supervisor or Premises licence holder shall display prominent, clear and legible notices at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

The Designated Premises supervisor or Premises licence holder shall ensure that instructions are given to staff to request that patrons leaving the premises do so in a quiet and orderly manner.

Take such steps as may be practicable to ensure that coaches, taxis and other vehicles attending the Premises do not allow engines to run whilst such vehicles are standing still so as to cause excessive noise or inconvenience to neighbouring residents or cause unnecessary obstructions to the public highway.

e) The protection of children from harm

The Designated Premises supervisor or Premises licence holder will keep a record that all staff who may sell alcohol have received training.

Premises will display at or near their entrance a A5 sized clear, legible, conspicuous notice stating, "It is illegal for an under 18 year old to attempt to purchase alcohol".

Designated Premises supervisor, Premises licence holders and other members of their staff will keep a register detailing when alcohol and cigarettes have attempted to be purchased by someone suspected as being underage. This register will detail the person who refused the sale, the date and time and the product subject to the attempted purchase, details surrounding the attempted purchase and detail/description of the person attempting the purchase.

This register will be available to all staff selling age-restricted products, for their referral prior to them starting work each day. The register should be available for inspection by a Trading Standards officer, police officer or Licensing officer.

Where events that attract young persons are held at premises, the Designated Premises supervisor or Premises licence holder will display a clear, conspicuous and legible notice stating that anyone purchasing or attempting to purchase alcohol for someone under 18 years will commit an offence and will be refused the sale of alcohol for that event.

Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.

- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
- For example the type of activity to be authorised, if not already stated, and give relevant further details, for example (but not exclusively) whether or not music will be amplified or unamplified.
- For example (but not exclusively), where the activity will occur on additional days during the summer months.
- For example (but not exclusively), where you wish the activity to go on longer on a particular day e.g. Christmas Eve.
- Please give timings in 24 hour clock (e.g. 16.00) and only give details for the days of the week when you intend the premises to be used for the activity.
- If you wish people to be able to consume alcohol on the premises, please tick 'on the
 premises'. If you wish people to be able to purchase alcohol to consume away from the
 premises, please tick 'off the premises'. If you wish people to be able to do both, please
 tick 'both'.
- 9. Please give information about anything intended to occur at the premises or ancillary to the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children, regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups or the presence of gaming machines.
- 10. Please list here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
- 11. The application form must be signed.
- An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
- Where there is more than one applicant, each of the applicants or their respective agent must sign the application form.
- 14. This is the address which we shall use to correspond with you about this application.

15. Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as
 the child of the holder, is a British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the
 right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to
 copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an
 endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or
 has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official
 document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name
 issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home
 Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the
 UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from
 doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in
 combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their
 permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office
 acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the
 person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such
 as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member – e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

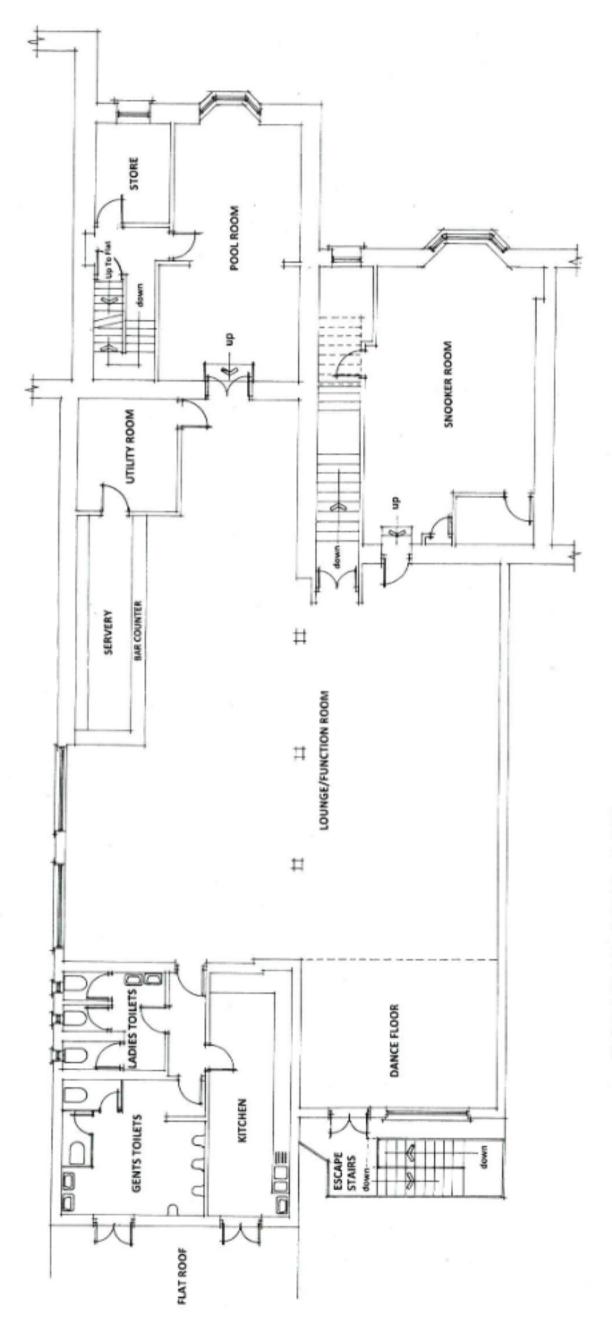
Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

(i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;

- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

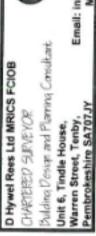
If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
