a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

We will comply with our licensing conditions and the designated premises supervisor will monitor that the licensing objectives are adhered to.

The designated premises supervisor will be able to be contacted when off the premises.

Staff will be given training on the licensing objectives and legislation surrounding the supply of alcohol and only specified staff members will be given permission by the designated premises supervisor to sell alcohol.

Alcohol will only be served with meals and will only be wine and local craft beer.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Meals will only be served until 2000 hours.

Staff will be trained on the laws regarding the sale of alcohol to underage people. No sale of alcohol will be made to persons suspected of being intoxicated.

As we are a family restaurant any disorderly or aggressive behaviour will not be tolerated.

c) Public safety

Any disorderly or aggressive behaviour will not be tolerated & persons displaying such behaviour will politely be refused service.

Glass bottles will be collected regularly & safely disposed of via Pembrokeshire Council trade recycling.

Empty bottles will not be removed from premises between 2200 hours and 0700 hours.

First aid kit on premises.

Notice will be displayed identifying the location of the first aid box.

Telephone on premises for use in an emergency.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We will only be serving alcohol & meals until 20:00 hours so there will be no latenight customers leaving the café.

All waste is removed and recycled on a regular basis by Pembrokeshire Council trade waste and we have a wooden fence enclosing our wheelie bins.

All deliveries to the premises are made within normal working hours.

Off sales of alcohol will be presentation/gift packs of the craft beers available and in sealed containers.

e) The protection of children from harm

We will adopt a challenge 25 protocol and display posters informing customers of

Staff will be given training in the laws surrounding under age sales of alcohol & how to check id.

We will adopt a challenge 25 regime and a reliable proof of age document will be asked for if a customer appears under that age.

Only acceptable documents will be driving licence, PASS card or passport which will be checked by a supervisor.

If neither document is produced no sale of alcohol will be made.

Records will be kept of any refusals of the sale of alcohol.

Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

 right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to
 copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an
 endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or
 has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official
 document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name
 issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home
 Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the
 UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from
 doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in
 combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their
 permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office
 acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the
 person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such
 as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member – e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

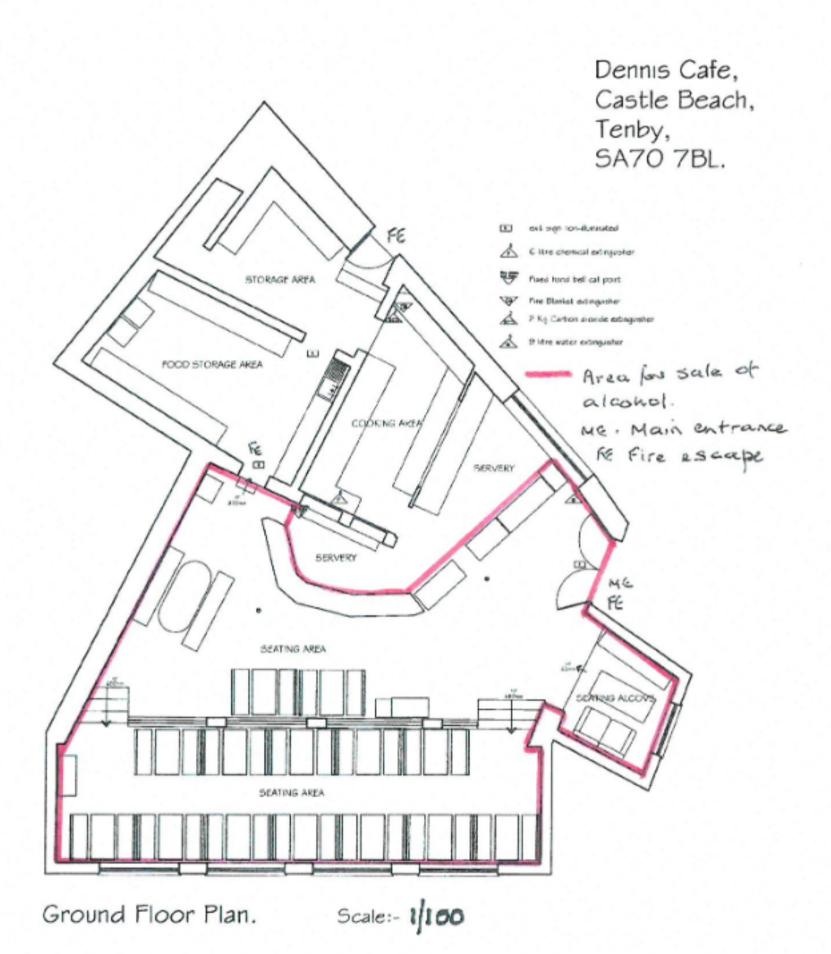
Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
