Additional Learning Needs (ALN) Reforms - what will this mean to parents?

Since 2007, Welsh Government has been working on updating the special educational needs system in Wales, and is now in the process of bringing in new legislation. In February, the ALN Draft Code of Practice was published, and the ALNET Bill is currently being passed through Government.

The Bill has 3 clear aims.

- 1. To ensure all learners with ALN are supported to overcome barriers to learning.
- 2. Improve planning and delivery of support, placing learners needs, views, wishes and feelings at the heart of process.
- Early identification of needs and timely interventions which are monitored and adapted to ensure they deliver desired outcomes.

Changes to will include:

- Extending the age range from 0 25 to include further education colleges and specialist independent colleges (although not higher education or apprenticeships);
- Individual Development Plans (IDP's) replacing current plans and Statements to one unified Plan for all learners with additional learning needs-
- Person centred Planning tools are used throughout the process to ensure the learner is at the centre at all times

TAPPAS 3 - what is it?

In each cluster of schools, there are a team of local professionals who support schools and families of children and young people with additional needs. The meetings are held termly in each area and provide a range of advice and support for families about additional learning difficulties. Each term the Inclusion Support Team will highlight key themes or developments that are taking place locally or nationally.

We will offer 1:1 sessions with:

- Specific Learning Difficulties Advisor (Dyslexia, Dyspraxia, Dyscalculia).
- Paediatric Occupational Therapist.
- Educational Psychologist.
- Parent Partnership Officer.

The Inclusion support team host the termly TAPPAS 3 events for parents, and every term we review in response to feedback from parents as to what they would like from the next terms TAPPAS 3.

New Trinity Carers Project Launched

A new project has been launched by Pembrokeshire County Council to provide short periods of respite for the parents or carers of children with additional learning needs or a disability.

The Trinity Carers Project will provide the parent or carer with respite while the child participates in a social activity with a member of staff.

Project officers will work with the child's family to arrange an appropriate time and activity such as a cinema, meal out, or bowling with other children or young people.

Families do not need a social worker to access the service. There must also be working or diagnosed ALN or disability, a clear need, and the child must be aged between 5 and 16.

The project is being provided by the County Council's Integrated Service Team. The team is a provision for families of children and young people with additional learning needs or a disability who may need support for a period to resolve concerns or issues that arise. The Trinity Carers Project is one of the preventative services which the team offers.
