Prioritisation Maps

- 8.81 The following maps depict the criteria used for the prioritisation of identified green infrastructure opportunities (see **Appendix 2** and **Appendix 4**) and which were used to identify 'key zones for generic green infrastructure opportunities' (see the town overview maps within the **Action Plan**).
- 8.82 These maps show the distance of opportunities from existing green infrastructure assets and important features for each green infrastructure themes (see **Table 8.1**). Key projects and key zones for generic green infrastructure opportunities were identified in locations of deficiency in existing green infrastructure connectivity (**Figure 8.35**) and an in priority locations based on each green infrastructure theme (**Figure 8.36 Figure 8.55**).

Biodiversity	What is the biodiversity value of the site?	WWBIC Pembrokeshire Biodiversity value: Opportunities were prioritised in locations where biodiversity value is lower.
Cultural heritage	How far is the nearest heritage asset?	Designated heritage assets heat map: Opportunities were prioritised in locations where designated heritage assets are closer.
Health and well-being	Within an area of health deprivation?	Index of multiple deprivations – health deprivation: Opportunities were prioritised in locations where there are higher levels of health deprivation.
	Within an area of physical environment deprivation?	Index of multiple deprivations – physical environment deprivation: Opportunities were prioritised in locations where there are higher levels of physical environment deprivation.
	Within an AQMA?	Air Quality Management Areas: Opportunities were prioritised in locations that are within Air Quality Management Areas (AQMAs).

	How far are the nearest active travel routes or open space?	Active transport and open space: Opportunities were prioritised in locations where active transport routes, public transport nodes and open spaces are further away.
Landscape	All opportunities have the same baseline for this theme	Landscape Character Areas: There are various landscapes characters present across Pembrokeshire that should be reflected when developing opportunities. However, opportunities were prioritised based only on their potential to deliver landscape enhancements (see Appendix 1).
Recreation and play	How far is the nearest recreational facility?	Recreation heat map: Opportunities were prioritised in locations where recreational facilities are further away.
Social and Economic Regeneration	Within an area of regeneration?	Regeneration masterplans: Opportunities were prioritised in locations that are identified within adopted and emerging regeneration masterplans.
	Within an area of deprivation?	Index of multiple deprivations – overall deprivation: Opportunities were prioritised in locations where there are higher levels of overall deprivation.
	How many people could this opportunity benefit?	Population density: Opportunities were prioritised in locations where there are higher population densities.
Flooding	Within a flood zone?	Flood zones: Opportunities were prioritised in locations that are within flood zones.
	Within an area identified for natural flood prevention measures?	Natural capital flood prevention analysis opportunities: Opportunities were prioritised in locations that are identified as having natural capital flood prevention opportunities.









Figure 8.37: Biodiversity - Biodiversity Value (Source: WWBIC)























Figure 8.46: Social and Economic Regeneration - Fishguard and Goodwick emerging masterplan (Source: Pembrokeshire County Council)





Figure 8.47: Social and Economic Regeneration - Haverfordwest adopted masterplan (Source: Adopted Haverfordwest - A Vision for the Future, Pembrokeshire County Council)




