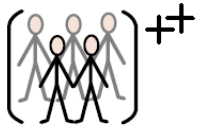


## Questions and Answers

We started the project in November 2018.



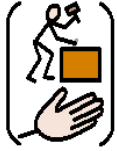
We will be running co-production events in February 2019.

Some people have help from others so that they can go out and do different things.



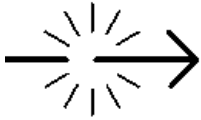
Some people have a Direct Payment and choose to pay for a personal assistant to help them to do things they like.



Some organisations can help people to volunteer and go to work.



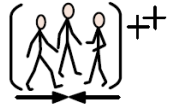
Some people like to go to clubs in their community with other people who like the same things.



## What will happen?



We will be talking to people about the project in November and December 2018.



We will be running co-production events in February 2019 so that people can come and tell us what they think.



We will be running a consultation in May, June and July 2019.



We will tell the Council what people think in August 2019.



We hope that new things will start to happen in September 2019.

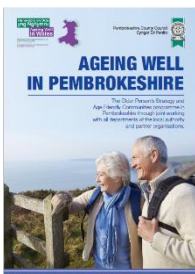

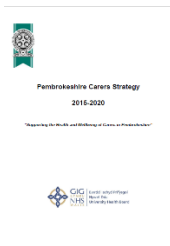

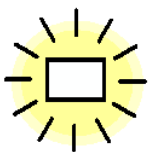

The people who are running the events are really good at helping people to have their voices heard.



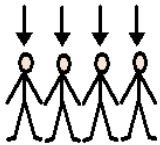
They can use lots of tools to help people if they need help to communicate.
