Privacy Notice - Free School Meals

1. Why do we collect and use your personal information?

We collect and use your personal information so that we can assess and award your application to free school meals. The personal data you provide to us is because there is a statutory requirement for you to do so in line with the below Act.

The Processing of your data is because it is necessary for the performance of this public task to do so in line with the Education Act 2005.

2. How Information about you is used.

The information that you provide will be processed according to the General Data Protection Regulation 2016 and Data Protection Act 2018 and the Education Act 2005.

We have a duty to protect the public funds we administer and may use the information provided by you to detect and prevent fraud. To assist us with this, information provided by you in relation to your free school meals application will be cross-checked internally with Education, Housing, Council Tax and Housing Benefits/Council Tax Reduction, Catering and your child's school.

In light of the recent changes to free school meal awards and payments as a result of the Coronavirus outbreak, we will also share information externally with Cifas to detect and prevent fraud. We will also make any disclosures required by law and we may also share this information with other bodies responsible for detecting/preventing fraud/crime or auditing/administering public funds to ensure money is targeted and spent in the most appropriate and cost effective way. In order to achieve this, information will be shared with our Audit Service within Pembrokeshire County Council and with The Auditor General for Wales.

We will not make any disclosures to third parties for marketing purposes.

Your data will be secure and confidential at all times and we will only collect the personal information that is required to provide you with our service.

The categories of personal data being collected are:

- Name and Date of Birth of parent/guardian/person with parental responsibility
- Address of parent/guardian/ person with parental responsibility
- National Insurance Number of parent/guardian/ person with parental responsibility
- Email address of parent/guardian/ person with parental responsibility
- Bank account details of parent/guardian/ person with parental responsibility
- Name and Date of birth of child
- Details of evidence of welfare benefits in payment (those which meet the eligibility cirteria for Free School Meals)

3. How long do we keep hold of your information?

We will retain the information provided to us for 15 years and your information will be securely disposed of once it is no longer required. For details on Cifas retention please see link below:

5. Your Rights.
