

PRIVACY NOTICE - Self Isolation Payments

This privacy notice covers how Pembrokeshire County Council (as a Data Controller) will collect, use and share your personal data for the purposes of Revenue Services processing the Self Isolation payment scheme.

Why we need your information (purpose of processing)

We collect and use your personal information so that we can to allow Revenue Services to check and assess eligibility to the Self Isolation Payment.

The information that you provide will be processed according to the General Data Protection Regulation 2016, the Data Protection Act 2018 and Welsh Government Guidance - https://gov.wales/self-isolation-support-scheme

Your data will be crossed check with the Department for Work and Pensions, the NHS the Trace, Test and Protect Register, and HMRC. .

We will also make any disclosures required by law and we may also share this information with other bodies responsible for detecting/preventing fraud/crime or auditing/administering public funds to ensure money is targeted and spent in the most appropriate and cost effective way. In order to achieve this, information will be shared with our Audit Service within Pembrokeshire County Council and with The Auditor General for Wales.

We will not make any disclosures to third parties for marketing purposes.

Your data will be secure and confidential at all times and we will only collect the personal information that is required to provide you with our service.

What personal data are being collected?

The categories of personal data being collected are:

- Name, address, date of birth, national insurance number.
- Employers name and address
- If self employed your UTR number
- Details of your bank account, benefit entitlement, wage slip and self employed accounts
- Details of savings and further income details where required.
- Details of any isolation period related to Covid-19 and confirmation you have been contacted by NHS Wales Test, Trace, Protect programme.

What is our legal basis for processing your personal data?

The General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) requires specific conditions to be met to ensure that the processing of your personal data is lawful. These relevant conditions are below;

Article 6 (1)(e) Public task: the processing is necessary for you to perform a task in the public interest or for your official functions, and the task or function has a clear basis in law.

Some types of personal data are more sensitive than others, and need more protection. This is classed as 'special category data' and could include information about your racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs or trade union membership and the processing of genetic or biometric data, health and sex life and sexual orientation.

In terms of processing Isolation Payments we will be verifying with the NHS Wales Test, Trace Protect register that you have been requested to isolate. This may be either as a result of you testing positive for Covid-19 or as a Contact of someone who has tested positive. Consequently, we will be processing data relating to your health if you have tested positive.

We process this type of special category data as it is necessary for reasons of:

Article 9 (2)(g) Substantial public interest. Detail here if there is a statutory obligation to provide personal data and list the appropriate legislation

We rely on Schedule 1, Part 2, Substantial Public Interest Conditions; Statutory etc and government purposes.

Article 9 (2)(i) Public interest in the areas of public health.

We rely on Schedule 1, Part 1, Conditions relating to Employment, Health and Research etc; (2)(1) Health or social care purposes and (3) Public health.

Who will we share your information with?

Your details will be checked against the NHS Wales Test, Trace and Protect register. This is to check that you have been formally told to self-isolate and the period of isolation.

We may need to share your personal data with internal departments, other organisations and third parties, this will include:

- Social Services to enable the correct processing of other payments such as Carer payments
- Our internal Creditors Section to process payment to you
- Our internal Contact Tracing team if we need to verify or validate any period of isolation
- HMRC to verify your employment details and confirm that a payment has been made
- The Department for Work and Pensions to verify entitlement to a qualifying benefit
- Revenue Services for the purposes of verifying entitlement to council tax reduction

Pembrokeshire County Council has a duty to protect the public fund it manages. Therefore, the information that you have provided to us may be used for the prevention and detection of fraud and for auditing purposes both internally and externally.

How long do we keep hold of your information?

Pembrokeshire County Council will only keep your information for as long as is necessary, we will retain the information provided to us for 6 + 1 years and your information will be securely disposed of once it is no longer required.

Your Rights

Under the General Data Protection Regulation 2016 and Data Protection Act 2018, you have rights as an individual including:

- The right to **Rectification** you have the right to ask to have your information corrected.
- The right to **Restrict** processing may apply you may request that we stop processing your personal data however, this may delay or prevent us delivering a service to you. We will seek to comply with your request but may be required to hold or process information to comply with our legal duties.
- The right to **Object** this is not an absolute right and will depend on the reason for processing your personal information.
- The right to Erasure you may request that we erase your personal data however, this may delay
 or prevent us delivering a service, or continuing to deliver a service. We will seek to comply with
 your request but may be required to hold or process information to comply with our legal duties.
- The right to not be subject to Automated decision making and profiling.
- The right of **Access** you have the right to ask us for copies of your personal data. To make a request, please contact:
